Meewasin Skating Rink – One of the Best Outdoor Skating Spots in Canada

Meewasin skating rink, voted the “best outdoor skating spot in Canada” by Readers Digest in 2006, is about to get better. As Canadians we know that skating on an outdoor rink is a big part of what it means to be Canadian. With this in mind it only made sense that one of the first projects by Meewasin in the 1980’s was the creation of a free outdoor skating rink on the bank of the South Saskatchewan River in downtown Saskatoon. In operation for nearly 30 years, the rink hosts over 10,000 local residents yearly and numerous visitors from all over the world. Some of the more notable visitors have included personalities such as Elvis Stojko, Tracey Wilson, Kurt Browning, Gene Simmons and Shannon Tweed. Just this past week the “Great One” Wayne Gretsky and Prime Minister Stephen Harper paid the rink a visit and spent time with some local school students.

During its thirty years of operation, the Meewasin Rink has been very well used and the time had come to breathe some new life into it and the surrounding Kiwanis Memorial Park. Through the Recreational Infrastructure Canada (RIInC) program, and, with financial support from the Government of Canada, the Government of Saskatchewan, and the City of Saskatoon, Meewasin will do just that.

The project has three distinct elements: a permanent building housing washroom facilities that will operate year round, a mobile seasonal skating lodge, and trail enhancements to improve barrier-free access to the rink and Kiwanis Park. **CONT'D pg. 2**

Caring For Our Watersheds - Continued

Students can enter one of two categories: grades 7-9 or grades 10-12. Independently, or as a team of no more than four, students identify a concern that impacts the watershed in their area. They must come up with an idea to address the concern and can discuss their idea with their parents, teachers, friends and local experts. Students research their idea and explain it in an approximately 1,000 word report, as well as using graphics, models, pictures or videos. Entries are judged on innovation, environmental impact, comprehensive scope, research, realistic solution, written presentation and visuals.

As sustainability and heritage conservation are both important to Meewasin, the City of Saskatoon will be providing the project with tempered glass that was salvaged from the old 19th Street Saskatoon Arena. This glass will be used in the windows for the permanent washroom facilities.

This is a very exciting project for Meewasin, the City of Saskatoon and the thousands of Saskatoon residents who use the rink every year. The project will provide an accessible site and facility that will continue the tradition of free outdoor skating in downtown Saskatoon for many years to come.

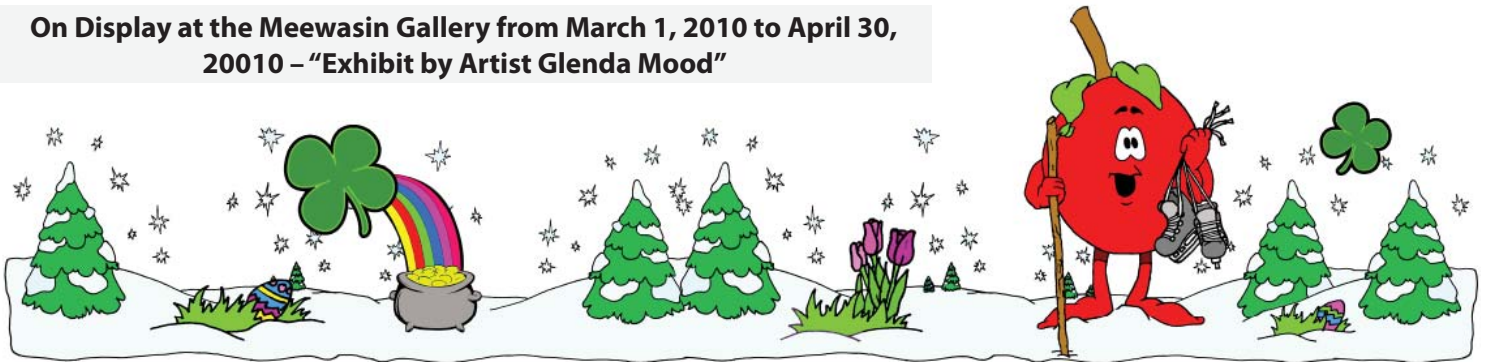

The Birds Thank the Saskatoon Nature Society.

Throughout this winter season the birds of Beaver Creek Conservation Area have been able to depend on a steady supply of seed thanks to generous funding from the Saskatoon Nature Society. From Black Capped Chickadees, Hoary and Common Redpolls, Downy and Hairy Woodpeckers, Pine Grosbeaks, and Blue Jays - all are frequent users of the feeding stations. Visitors also delight in having the Black Capped Chickadees feed directly from their hands!

Try an "Eye Spy - Predator and Prey" activity trail and see if you can survive the day. Ask staff for some black oil sunflower seeds and invite the chickadees to feed from your hand.



About Beaver Creek Conservation Area



Beaver Creek Conservation Area is located 13 km south of Saskatoon. A sheltered creek, river valley, and prairie habitat offer a diversity of flora and fauna for visitors. It is the microcosm of the Meewasin Valley, and contains one of the few uncultivated short grass prairie sites in Saskatchewan. An interpretive centre and staff provide opportunities to discover nature during the four seasons along a selection of four nature trails.

Conservation areas like Beaver Creek are set aside to protect and manage important natural and cultural heritage resources. They are maintained for your enjoyment and education, as well as for future generations.
