Meewasin Valley Authority - Beaver Creek Conservation Area Grade 5 Environmental Education Program - September 2019 – June 2020 Changes Effective September 2019

- BCCA will now host two Grade 5 classes on site at the same time with classes using the Interpretive Centre and Chip's Lodge as their staging areas.
- Program offered on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday.
- Programs will be offered in the Fall, Winter, and Spring program seasons.
- Programs to be presented with <u>One Teacher & One Interpreter</u> (with the exception of Winter which will have two interpreters and teacher assisting).
- Teacher inservices available each season to inform you of new program content and format.
- Teachers will be presenting a program that explores the ecology of birds through prepared introduction and conclusion materials, collection of hands on artifacts, bird trivia cards, and facilitating the hand feeding of the black capped chickadees. It is recognized that teachers have busy schedules and this program presentation will be designed for ease of delivery for the teacher.
- Interpreter to present a habitat based program requiring site knowledge and answer student and teacher questions.

Fall & Spring Program (One Teacher & One Interpreter)

Classes are divided into two groups with the <u>Teacher leading the "VIB – Very Important Birds" program</u> and <u>Interpreter leading the "Habitats are Homes" program</u>.

Program Concepts

"VIB - Very Important Birds" Program

Birdwatching is a form of citizen science promoting habitat conservation. The study of birds touches on a number of other subjects - biology, history, geography, sociology, and politics. The more you understand about birds, their needs, and the challenges many species face, the more aware and possibly involved you're likely to become in supporting wildlife habitat conservation and restoration efforts.

During this program, participants will have the opportunity to observe birds using binoculars, learn how to identify different bird species, and possibly hand feed our resident Black-capped Chickadee. Students will participate in hands-on activities and learn many unique adaptations birds have to help them to survive and their inter-connections to many other species.

"Habitats are Homes" Program

During this program students will study the structure of natural systems present at BCCA and discuss how these systems could be created in our urbanized environment. Students will record observations and experiences in their Student Booklet.

Habitat is the place where a plant or animal lives and grows. It includes four important features: food, water, shelter, and space available to a species in an appropriate arrangement.

Habitat destruction occurs when natural habitats are no longer able to support the species present, resulting in the displacement or destruction of its biodiversity. Habitat destruction by human activity is mainly for the purpose of harvesting natural resources for industrial production and urbanization. Clearing habitats for agriculture is a principal cause of habitat destruction.

Lawns are not that useful to most birds, so planting the edges of them is a good opportunity to improve habitat. You can replicate the way nature reclaims clearings by planting some sheltering, dense shrubs around the outside and then shorter flowers and low shrubs and ground covers along the inside. Many birds eat a variety of insects, including aphids, mosquitoes, spiders and other bugs that may not be welcome in a yard or garden. Attracting birds encourages them to take advantage of this natural food source, eliminating the need for harsh chemical insecticides.
