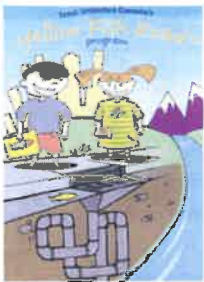
— PROTECT OUR RIVER! —



More than 60,000 Canadian youth and many more internationally have participated in the Yellow Fish Road™ program. Youth, like you are learning about their water supply and the impact their community has on their supply of clean water. Painting the storm drains with yellow fish is a reminder of the importance of clean water and properly disposing of hazardous wastes.

What's the Problem?

Unwanted household products discarded in storm drains flow directly through underground pipes into our river. These products do not go through the sewage treatment plant and endanger fish and other aquatic life. They also harm our river water which we use for recreation, cooking and drinking. These harmful products include used motor oil, pesticides, herbicides, gasoline, antifreeze, paint thinner, paints, pet waste and other common household products.



How Can YOU Make a Difference?

- Schools, communities and youth groups from all over Canada have marked more than 100,000 storm drains with yellow fish, and now you can too!
- Yellow Fish Road™ is effective because youth learn and share their knowledge by taking action to help ensure clean water in their community.
- Take a few minutes to inform and/or remind others that what goes into the storm sewer goes directly to our river.

- Any school or community group can participate in the Yellow Fish Road™ program.
- Local actions and painting storm drains in Saskatoon usually takes place from mid-April to late June.
- Painting kits are available and can be borrowed from the Girls Guides in Saskatoon.
- You can even develop your own kits! Hangers and stencils can be ordered directly from the Yellow Fish Road™ website.
- You can paint a storm sewer with a yellow fish at your school OR in your neighbourhood.



Get Started!

1. Visit the Yellow Fish Road™ website and download the program guide, which has all the things you will need to put this program into action.
2. Get your class, school or community group together.
3. Register online on the Yellow Fish Road™ website at www.yellowfishroad.org.
4. Contact the Girl Guides, (306) 652-3275, and borrow a Yellow Fish Road painting kit.
5. Have fun with your painting event!
6. Once you have completed your storm sewer painting, enter your data on the Yellow Fish Road™ website.
