Meewasin's Pelican Watch Contest Returns!

Contest is open from March 1 – March 31, 2021

The feel-good contest of the year is back again to get you excited for spring! Guess the arrival time of the first pelican's return to the Weir for your chance to win some great prizes, including a prize pack worth over \$500 for the overall winner!

Saskatoon residents have special visitors every spring and summer. April through October, pelicans gather by the weir. These birds, once on the endangered species list, have been a beautiful sight on the South Saskatchewan River in Saskatoon since the late 1970's. For Saskatoon residents, their arrival is a harbinger of spring. Follow along on our social media for fun facts about pelicans through March!

In the past 24 years, the earliest and latest arrival dates of the pelicans have been: April 2 at 6:25 p.m. and April 20 at 4:36 p.m.

"The arrival of the American White Pelicans in Saskatchewan is an important spectacle", says Meewasin's Resource Management Officer, Renny Grilz, "Not only do these large birds represent the beginning of spring in our area, but pelicans are also a conservation success story; being the first species to be 'delisted' from the threatened species list in 1987. This is an important reminder that public engagement and education paired with effective conservation efforts, species that are in decline can thrive again."
