

CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

WHAT: Spadina Crescent Lift Station Construction

WHEN: October 2021 - Spring 2023

WHERE: 1702 Spadina Crescent

Saskatoon Water has contracted Graham Construction to build a new lift station at 1702 Spadina Crescent. The project will begin in October and it is expected to be completed by Spring 2023.

Common questions



Why is a new lift station necessary?

The existing Spadina Crescent Lift Station was built as a sewage disposal facility in the 1940s and re-purposed to a lift station in 1971. It helps move more than 60 per-cent of the city's wastewater from the sanitary sewer system to the Wastewater Treatment Plant. The lift station has been well maintained over the years but has reached a point where major modifications would be required for it to keep up with growing capacity. It is more cost effective to decommission the existing lift station and build a new one. The existing lift station will be demolished after the new station is in service. The bypass lift station, built on the same site in 2016, will continue to operate.



Will there be noise during construction?

Nearby residents who may notice typical construction noise between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Monday to Friday. Noise will not be a factor once the project is complete.



Will the Meewasin Trail be affected by construction?

The Meewasin Trail behind the lift station site will be closed during construction. Prior to the closure, a temporary paved trail is being constructed next to Spadina Crescent to accommodate all trail users. A map showing the trail detour is included on the back of this notice.
