Meewasin Announces the Valley-Wide Monitoring Framework

September 9, 2021

Meewasin is pleased to announce the creation of a Valley-wide Monitoring Framework that will help guide the development of the region with the direct involvement of the public.

The scope of Meewasin is a vast ecological corridor, currently spanning 67 square km, which is the equivalent of 13,400 football fields. Effectively monitoring this area and managing its resources is a challenge, one that Meewasin has been up to for more than 40 years.

Meewasin is in the early stages of using the Valley-wide Monitoring Framework to organize and identify data needed to manage this important natural area. As this project moves forward, Meewasin aspires to foster a collaborative network of regional monitoring-related partnerships designed to share knowledge, expand observational capacity, and inform best practices.

This process is largely internal, but the later stages of implementation of the strategy will require ongoing consultation and participation from local community members, conservation groups, traditional knowledgekeepers, partner institutions, and stakeholders.

Andrea Lafond, CEO of Meewasin spoke to the importance of this project, "Meewasin has always prided itself as being a leader in the conservation of ecosystems, both internally and with our various community partners. The Valley-wide Monitoring Framework is an expansion of that team but focused on the specific, important goal of retaining and reporting critical ecological data."
