



Meewasin Public Hearing Results

December 15, 2021

Proposed developments in the Meewasin Valley require approval from the Meewasin Valley Authority Board of Directors. The Board passed the following resolutions through the Development Review process at the public hearing during their December 3rd Board Meeting:

That the application by Nominee Corporation of Rowing Club Inc., Saskatoon Racing Canoe Club Inc., and Saskatoon Canoe Club for the proposed paddle dock replacement in Victoria Park be approved with the following conditions:

- *Permits, or approval in writing acknowledging that no permit is required, from Department of Fisheries and Oceans, Water Security Agency, Transport Canada, and any other authorities having jurisdiction*
- *Existing geotechnical report (Machibroda, 1987) to be considered in final engineering drawings to be submitted*

That the application by Arete Developments Inc. for a proposed five-storey condominium at 212/214 Saskatchewan Crescent East be approved with the following conditions:

- *Submission of final exterior design details, including bird strike mitigation strategies and exterior lighting.*
