Meewasin Celebrates Indigenous Peoples Day with New Land-Based Education Resources

June 21, 2022

Meewasin recognizes and acknowledges that the land and the water in the Meewasin Valley is part of Treaty Six Territory and the original homeland of the Métis and traditional trade and hunting territories of the Dakota. Meewasin honors this as part of our reconciliation efforts and recognizes the immense knowledge that is held by the traditional caretakers of this land as we do our best to steward it alongside them.

Through thoughtful and planned work, Meewasin Valley Authority as an organization is integrating First Nation and Métis perspectives into conservation and education in the Meewasin Valley. Over the past year, Meewasin has worked with Saskatoon Public Schools and Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools to develop a set of resources for secondary-level educators that encourage a higher level of thinking under the umbrella of Indigenous Ways of Knowing and societal impact.

These new digital resources create curriculum connections to a section of content in the Meewasin App called "Indigenous Connections to the Northeast Swale" as well as physical interpretive panels located at this site. They also include links to a variety of other content and have been designed to encourage teachers and students to take part in land-based activities throughout the Meewasin Valley.

CEO of Meewasin, Andrea Lafond, spoke of the project, "Meewasin is honored to have learned from the Elders and Knowledge Keepers who shared teachings for the Meewasin App and which, in turn, laid the groundwork for the development of these new digital education resources. Connecting to the past, understanding the present, building relationships, and setting goals for the future are essential outcomes of the activities and lessons."

Meewasin would like to acknowledge the partners that contributed to this project, the Saskatoon Public and Greater Saskatoon Catholic School divisions. Meewasin's team worked in partnership with very skilled and knowledgeable educators from each school division to develop and create this new series of individual curricular-linked lessons for Grade 9 through 12.
