Meewasin Launches Digital Platform for National Urban Park

Supported by a regional steering committee Meewasin continues work with Parks Canada to explore the potential for designation as a National Urban Park.

Meewasin recently developed a <u>digital platform</u> to share project details and updates with the public as they arise. Public engagement opportunities are anticipated later in 2023. Meewasin is committed to public participation in decision making and providing meaningful regional leadership to the exploration process.

"We know how important this project is to the community and want to update the public as much as possible. We are excited to continue work with the steering committee and technical experts to develop options for Saskatchewan's first national urban park," explained CEO for Meewasin Andrea Lafond.

The steering committee has representation from Meewasin, Parks Canada, Government of Saskatchewan, City of Saskatoon, RM of Corman Park, Saskatoon Tribal Council, Métis Nation of Saskatchewan, University of Saskatchewan and Wanuskewin Heritage Park.
