Meewasin Trail Opening/Funding Milestone Event

Over the last 44 years, Meewasin has been the steward of the South Saskatchewan River valley in the Saskatoon region. This includes the development of the Meewasin Trail, which is more than 105 km of multi-use pathways through the heart of the region. Meewasin is excited to announce that numerous trail-enhancing projects have been completed and others are underway as Meewasin received generous contributions from many partners. We are so grateful for the support from the Government of Canada and the Government of Saskatchewan, the Trans Canada Trail (TCT), the City of Saskatoon and many individual donors who have made this completion possible.

This event marks the completion of the Kinsmen Riverfront section of the Meewasin Trail, celebrates the recent improvements to Shakespeare on the Saskatchewan and the Southwest Trail, and provides important updates on the Kiwanis Trail enhancements and downtown Meewasin Trail upgrades that are coming soon.

A section of the Meewasin Trail has also been added to the TCT network in the Southwest.

Meewasin's goal is to enhance the Meewasin Trail to improve user experience and access. accommodate user volumes, and mitigate safety risks while enhancing natural features as much as possible.
