

Beaver Creek Bridge Repairs

Meewasin will be completing south bridge repairs at Beaver Creek this fall.

Beaver Creek Conservation Area has been a long favored spot for Saskatoon residents to take a step back from the city and connect with nature, particularly during the fall. The combination of the beautiful colors and migratory birds is hard to resist this beautiful site.

The bridge over the creek is one of the many perks of walking the trails at Beaver Creek. Though the bridge is a common place where the chickadees live, we will not be disturbing their habitat. To ensure safety for trail users, Meewasin plans for necessary repairs when needed. Meewasin is planning to complete the repairs for the south bridge at Beaver Creek mid to late September. The following repairs will be undertaken:

- Removal of the existing stairs north of the bridge
- Mowing of the access route to the bridge
- Installation of new screw pile foundations
- Bridge extensions
- Installation of new bridge decking and stairs
- Site restoration

During the active construction phase, the bridge, stairs and short trail connection heading north will be closed, however all other trails and the two bridges will remain open.
