Skating Season Comes to an End

February 28, 2025

The Cameco Meewasin Skating Rink @Nutrien Plaza is now closed for the season. Several days of temperatures above 0° celsius paired with clear skies have melted the surface of the rink, leaving the ice too slushy for skating.

The rink officially opened for the season on December 12, 2024 with temporary closures throughout the season due to extreme cold temperatures.

Even with these environmental challenges, the season was an overall success including a soldout Sip & Skate on a chilly Valentine's Day evening. This year, we had 8 guests return for their third Sip & Skate, and 14 guests returned for their second! The rink saw a total of 15,000 visitors for the 2024-2025 season.
