Clean-Up Campaign Kickoff

SASKATOON – The Meewasin Valley Authority is excited to announce the launch of the 44th annual Clean-Up Campaign, presented by Nutrien. This initiative encourages organizations, groups, and individuals to register, organize, and receive materials to safely pick up litter and restore the natural beauty of the Saskatoon area.

For over four decades, dedicated volunteers have joined forces in this campaign, collectively removing thousands of kilograms of waste from the community's natural spaces each year. These efforts help safeguard plants, animals and sensitive ecosystems from the detrimental effects of litter while enhancing the beauty of our shared environment.

The Meewasin Trail is the most popular recreation amenity in the Saskatoon region. In 2024, the trail experienced 2.365 million visits.
