A little piece of the valley to keep.



Paper Meadowlark Instructions:

1. Cut out the two mirrored meadowlarks as one piece. Do not cut them apart.
2. Cut out wings 2 and 3.
3. Glue wings 2 and 3 to the back of the main bird wings.
4. Fold the main bird along the dotted lines so the printed image faces outward. Fold along the belly and tail.
5. Fold the wings down and out to complete your meadowlark.
